





### **Scripture Lessons**

## **Romans 16:3-5**

<sup>3</sup>Greet Prisca and Aquila, who work with me in Christ Jesus, <sup>4</sup> and who risked their necks for my life, to whom not only I give thanks, but also all the churches of the Gentiles. <sup>5</sup>Greet also the church in their house. Greet my beloved Epaenetus, who was the first convert<sup>[a]</sup> in Asia for Christ.

## 1 Corinthians 16:19

<sup>19</sup>The churches of Asia send greetings. Aquila and Prisca, together with the church in their house, greet you warmly in the Lord. <sup>20</sup>All the brothers and sisters send greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss.

## Acts 18:2-3, 18-19, 24-26

<sup>2</sup>There he found a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had ordered all Jews to leave Rome. Paul <sup>1</sup> went to see them, <sup>3</sup> and, because he was of the same trade, he stayed with them, and they worked together—by trade they were tentmakers.

<sup>18</sup>After staying there for a considerable time, Paul said farewell to the believers and sailed for Syria, accompanied by Priscilla and Aquila. At Cenchreae he had his hair cut, for he was under a vow. <sup>19</sup>When they reached Ephesus, he left them there, but first he himself went into the synagogue and had a discussion with the Jews.

<sup>24</sup>Now there came to Ephesus a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria. He was an eloquent man, well-versed in the scriptures. <sup>25</sup>He had been instructed in the Way of the Lord; and he spoke with burning enthusiasm and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. <sup>26</sup>He began to speak boldly in the synagogue; but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained the Way of God to him more accurately.
