Changes to Meal Train

Dear St. Andrew.

As the pandemic is continuing to run its course, as deacons we are trying to continue to figure out ways in which we can serve you better. With that being said, we want to be able to provide meals to the congregation after surgeries, delivery of babies, hospital stays or whatever the circumstance might be in order to help your family.

The deacons have decided on two new ways in which we can be of help. The first is that deacons will be providing a meal initially for the family in need. We will always make sure of course that you do want it and a specific day in which you will be anticipating the dinner. After the deacons provide a meal, we will then ask if the family is interested in being on the meal train. However, we will not be offering home cooked meals as we want to be as careful as possible and don't want anyone infected. Therefore, we will ask others to purchase a meal and either deliver themselves or use a service like GrubHub, UberEats, or Doordash. It is your choice in how you go about providing the much needed meal.

We hope this will continue to be a way that the deacons can help out and serve the congregation similar to how we have done this in the past. In order for this to work, we will continue to need volunteers to purchase the meals and the participants to let us know when you're sick or in the hospital.

Thank you for your time and we look forward to helping and serving in this new way.





1 Peter 4: 7-11

⁷ The end of all things is near; therefore be serious and discipline yourselves for the sake of your prayers. ⁸ Above all, maintain constant love for one another, for love covers a multitude of sins. ⁹ Be hospitable to one another without complaining. ¹⁰ Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. ¹¹ Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" ¹⁴I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.
